He received his Ph.D. in 2003, in Anthropology from the University of Michigan. He also holds masters degrees from the University of Michigan and from Binghamton University, and a bachelors from Brown University.

Prof. Kosansky's research has focused on the Jews of Morocco; his courses at Lewis & Clark have been mainly in cultural anthropology, with emphasis on the Middle East.

Prof. Kosansky is also director of The Rabat Genizah Project, which is developing a digital archive of previously unavailable materials that documents the modern history of Jewish Morocco in its urban, national and regional contexts.
